


Types of Lake Basins




Moraine-dam lake: Mille Lacs Lake and Mille Lacs moraine.




Lake in basin produced by irregular deposition of till: Heron Lake in northwestern Jackson County.



Lakes in ice-block basins in till localized by preglacial valley.




Lakes related to glacial deposition: 1) basin formed by irregular deposition of till, 2) ice-block basins in till, 3) ice-block basin in till and outwash, 4) ice-block basins in outwash plain. (After Zumberge, 1952.)




Lake basins in bedrock valleys in eroded slate.



Lake in bedrock basin not related to preglacial valleys.



Oxbow lakes along the Mississippi River in Aitkin County. These are abandoned meander loops of the river.
